## Covid Update

Following the governments announcement on Thursday the 24th of February the rules around COVID have changed slightly.

Children who test positive should isolate for 5 days from the onset of symptoms, then can test using a lateral flow device and can only return to school after 2 daily consecutive negative tests from day 5 onwards or after 10 days even if they are still testing positive.
