## **Absence Reporting**

#### Reporting your child's absence to school due to illness

This is a courtesy reminder that if your child is unable to attend school due to illness, we require you to inform the school office by **no later than 9.00 a.m.** A message can be left on the dedicated pupil absence line (0115 914 7889, Option 1) or alternatively, you can speak directly to a member of staff in the school office by dialing the same telephone number and selecting Option 2. Please state the reason for your child's absence when reporting this to us.

## Punctuality at the start and end of the day

I take this opportunity to remind you all of the importance of your child being dropped off and picked up at the correct times.

**Start of the day**: Gates open at 08:30, staff are present to look after your children from this time, not any earlier. Please refrain from leaving your children unattended outside the gates before this time as we as a school are not responsible for their safety or wellbeing until they enter the school grounds.

The Whistle goes at 08:45 and children are expected to be in class by 08:55.

End of the Day: KS1 and Foundation finish their day at 15:10. KS2 finish at 15:20.

Please make sure you are on time to collect your child. We have a few parents who are regularly late for collection. If you are later than 15 minutes from the official end of the day, we will organise for your child to be looked after by the after school club and you will be charged for their attendance.

However please do not take this that you can leave your child for 15 minutes every day as regular lateness will result in a meeting with me.

Please avoid sitting on the wall that runs parallel to the allotments, as this is making it difficult to see parents waiting to pick up.

Please also stand behind the first yellow line that you encounter on the playground providing space for the teachers to see the adults waiting for their children.

Apologies if these seems like a moan but this is all to keep your children safe.
