Our school was built in 1974 and is part of the Our Lady of Lourdes Catholic Multi Academy Trust, serving the Parish of The Annunciation, Rushcliffe. This is made up of the churches of The Holy Spirit, West Bridgford, St Ann's Radcliffe, St Margaret Clitherow, Keyworth and Our Lady of Grace, Cotgrave.

Our school environment is an ordered and creative learning space. Classrooms reflect the broad, balanced curriculum with displays that showcase and support the children to 'know and remember'.

Prompts on displays are used to encourage independence and to celebrate achievements. Children are proud of the school and are actively engaged in developing the learning environment.

We also enjoy and benefit from regular time in our school allotment. Working with our own horticulturalist, the children experience the richness of every season. They plant, weed, water, maintain, harvest and enjoy the fruits of their labours.

This is crucial to our commitment in our role as custodians of the planet and our responsibility to take care of our world. As a Green Flag Eco School, we take this aspect of learning very seriously.

Our curriculum

At St Edmund Campion, all children engage in a rich, bespoke curriculum that is ambitious, innovative, creative and stimulating – equipping them with the essential knowledge and skills needed to succeed in life and be the best that they can be.

We want every child to achieve their potential and focus on the development of our pupils as individuals, guiding them to develop socially, academically, emotionally and spritually. Through our inclusive curriculm and quality first teaching, we endeavour to meet the needs of all pupils. We aspire to grow and nurture articulate thinkers who have a genuine love of learning. We create independent, active learners, who are able to think critically and overcome barriers.

Throughout their learning journey at St Edmund Campion, we aim to provide our children with the cultural capital they need to succeed in life and the confidence and courage to pursue their dreams, knowing that nothing will stand between them and their goals.

Teaching and learning

At St Edmund Campion we aim to create a positive and supportive environment for all pupils. We know our pupils and understand their learning needs. Our teaching staff use a range of approaches and strategies to ensure that all pupils make excellent progress.

We are a fully inclusive school and set high expectations, giving every learner the confidence they need to succeed. We have identified the key knowledge and skills within each curriculum area and this has been carefully sequenced throughout the school. Within each lesson we establish what the children already know and build on this, creating secure foundations for subsequent learning.

Within the classroom and beyond, we make creative use of a range of learning opportunities, including the use of ICT. We encourage pupils to take an active part in their learning – developing the ability to think systematically, manage information, learn from others and help others learn. Educational visits and outside speakers are also used to enrich the curriculum and bring the learning to life.









Beyond the curriculum

We offer a range of extra-curricular activities to enrich the experience for our children.

These include music, dance, drama and sporting clubs. Our extracurricular activities regularly include football, basketball, multi-skills, music, drama, dance, art, choir and modern foreign languages.

Developing the whole child

Wraparound care

Childcare at St Edmund Campion starts at 7.30am and continues until 5.45pm. Working with the Wolds Breakfast and After School care we are able to provide a varied timetable of activities. Children are provided with breakfast and an afterschool 'tea'. They participate in sports and creative activities all on the school site. We acknowledge that this supports families who require an extended day for their children.

Forest Schools

We are committed to learning both indoors and beyond the classroom and acknowledge that 'nature is our teacher'. All children participate in a programme of Forest Schools every year, led by our fully trained staff. Our children are encouraged to take risks in a managed way, develop skills, work together, become more confident and have fun.

Enrichment activities

We acknowledge the importance of sport in our children's development. Physical Education is part of our curriculum that focuses on the development of skills. There are boundless opportunities to represent the school in competitive competitions.

We are part of the Rushcliffe Schools Sports Partnership. As part of this partnership, children compete and participate in a wide variety of festivals and competitions including basketball, cross country, multi- sports, rowing and swimming.

We encourage competition, fair play and good sporting behaviour both locally and as far as The Camp Nou, Barcelona and Parc des Princes, Paris. Through sport we know that our children develop individual and team work skills all whilst maintaining our values of working hard, being kind and showing respect to ourselves, our team and our opponents.

Achieving full potential

At St Edmund Campion, we acknowledge the value music brings as an academic subject and an enjoyment in a more general way.

From Year 1, children have the opportunity to learn to play the recorder. They can continue to do this throughout their years at our school. In Year 4, children have the opportunity to take part in individual music lessons with a wide range of musical instruments offered – drums, flute, clarinet, brass instruments, violins, cello and guitar.

We love to sing at St Edmund Campion – as part of our liturgical worship and in a broader context. We encourage all our children to find their voice, to feel the joy of singing together. We have a number of choirs and regularly sing in public, such as the Christmas light switch on in West Bridgford and school fayre.

Opportunities for personal development

Our children have the opportunity to develop creatively. The school has recently been awarded the Arts Mark Award, with some pupils displaying their artwork at the Royal Academy of Arts.

Our programme of residential visits supports the development of every child. Children from Year 4 onwards have the opportunity to take part in a range of residential experiences.

These include PGL (outdoor adventure activity centre) in Year 4.

In Year 5, the opportunity to take part in a five day visit Berlin to support our modern foreign languages curriculum.

Two further visits follow in Year 6. One to the Briars Diocesan Youth Centre in Derbyshire and the other to Overstrand Hall in Norfolk.



Our community

We value our excellent relationship with parents and welcome their support and involvement. Parents and carers make an invaluable contribution to our school: volunteers listen to children read, help with activities such as cooking and sporting events and assist on educational visits.

Our Parents Association organise and host a wide range of events for the enjoyment and benefit of our children and families.

We appreciate the importance of good communication to keep parents informed about their child and events happening in school. Assemblies, performances, concerts, sports days and many other events give us an opportunity to share the breadth of experience the children enjoy at St Edmund Campion.

Working closely with all the local secondary schools, we ensure the best transition for pupils, this includes pupil visits to new schools by children and staff.
