

SEC Behaviour Curriculum

Foundation – Year 6



Introduction

At St Edmund Campion we develop children's character through the 'SEC Behaviour Curriculum', defining the behaviours and habits that we expect students to demonstrate. We want to support our pupils to grow into adults who are kind and respectful and who put others before themselves.

Teaching the Behaviour Curriculum

The curriculum is taught during the first week of the Advent term and then revisited and reinforced throughout the year.

Teachers will also demonstrate these behaviours and ensure pupils have many opportunities to practise these (particularly in the first few days of each term).

Adaptations

While the Behaviour Curriculum is intended for all pupils, staff should consider that some adaptations may be necessary, depending on the age and needs of the child.

Our Values

Moving around school

Know that we walk around school using **SEC Walking**

- Facing forwards
- walking at a steady pace, in a straight line,
- with hands behind your back, without talking.
- Walk on the left of the corridor

Know that we use SEC Walking to keep everyone safe in school

Classroom routines

Know that we use **SEC Listening** in class. This means that we –

- Face forwards, hands together
- Sit up straight
- Never interrupt
- Track the speaker

Know that we all use SEC Listening to ensure everybody is able to learn without distractions.

- Know the order that you line up
- Know that you should line up without leaning against the walls
- Know the routine for entering the classroom and starting work
- Know where to hang up your coat in the cloakroom
- Know that you should go to the toilet at playtime/lunchtime

Speaking in Class

- know that you must answer in full sentences when appropriate
- know that you must keep your hands away from your mouths while speaking
- know that you must speak loudly and clearly in class discussions
- know that it is polite to look at the person you are speaking to

Completing work in books

- Know that each piece of work needs a date and title.
- Know that you must use 'one square, one digit' in writing in maths books.
- Know how to underline titles using a ruler

Manners

- Know that we must use an adult's name when talking to members of staff
- know that you must say 'please' and thank you'
- know that we should say 'excuse me' if someone is in your way
- Know that you should wait to let others pass through a doorway before walking through yourself.
- Know that you should say 'Good morning/afternoon' to adults if spoken to.
- Know that it is polite to give **eye contact** to the person you are talking to.

Playtime Behaviour

- Know that you must play safely without hurting anyone
- Know that we do not 'play fight' because we may hurt someone by accident
- Know that you must be **kind** when playing games and sharing equipment.
- Know that you should stand still when the whistle goes and wait instruction to return to class
- Know that you should walk independently and in silence back to class.

Lunchtime

- Know where you line up for lunchtime when you are called
- Know where you sit in the dinner hall
- Know that you should use a quiet voice in the dinner hall.
- Know that you should always try to use a knife and fork
- Know that you should finish what you are eating before leaving.
- Know how to use good manners during lunchtime (please/thank you)

End of the day routine

- Know that pupils must stay in a straight line while walking across the playground until they reach their meeting point on the playground.
- Know that they must stand in front of the teacher at the meeting point.
- Know that they must not go home until the teacher has checked that the correct adult is present
- Know that these procedures are put in place to keep all children safe at home-time.

Behaviour outside school

- Know that when you are wearing your school uniform you are representing the school community and must always behave responsibly and respectfully.
- Know that you should be considerate of other people arriving and leaving school (walking not running, not shouting)
